#### **Eligibility Requirements for Athletes**

All athletes competing in the NAIG must be of Canadian and/or American Indigenous ancestry. All participants must provide proof of ancestry.

Tribal Identification Card or Certificate of Indian Blood

Academic Performance -Grades (2.0) -Attendance (90%) -Excellent Behavior -Community Service (16hrs) **Team Participation** -Practices -Training Events -Team Meetings **Athletes Residency** - must be permanent resident of the contingent they are competing for. - Must live in the state that the athlete is playing for 180 days prior to the games. (6 months)

#### O All Ute Tribal Member Athletes

 (Fee covers registration, team apparel and portion of transportation)\* (TBD)

- (Fee covers registration, team apparel and transportation)\*(TBD)
- Passport and outside expenses (souvenir and outside meals\* not provided by the Host Society are the responsibly of the athlete)

### <u>Passports:</u> You Must have one to travel

- Forms must be filled out in Black Ink
  - If you make a mistake just line through it and add correction
  - Make Appointments Online at USPS.com/Scheduler
  - DS-11 is for new passports
  - DS-82 is for a renewal of an adult's passport
- Things you need
  - Citizenship evidence
  - Identification
  - Proof of relationship (for children under 16)
- Photo
  - Can be done at the Ignacio Post Office or Durango Post Office
- Cost:
  - \$120\* (15 and younger)
  - \$150\* (adult passport)

### **Covid-19 Vaccination Form**

- Definition: Fully Vaccinated- To be fully vaccinated in the province of Nova Scotia.
- Individuals need receipt of 1 dose of vaccine authorized as 1 dose vaccine, such as Janssen, plus 14 days.
- Or 2 doses of a vaccine authorized as a 2 dose vaccine series, such as Pfizer, Moderna or AstraZeneca, plus 14 days.
- Applying for an exemption: To apply for an exemption of the Covid-19 vaccination declaration, participants must complete the following.
- Vaccination Exemption Form
- Chef de Mission is required to sign the document
- Form must be completed by December 15, 2022, at which point no further exemption forms will be accepted.
- Review of form will be completed within 60 days.

#### **Code of Conduct**

All participants of Team Colorado will uphold the rules and regulations that govern the North American Indigenous Games. All participants on Team Colorado which includes our Athletes, Coaches, Managers, and Mission Staff will display behavior in accordance with the Spirit of the Games. We will act as ambassadors for our family, our community and our province/territory/state. Under the leadership of the Chef de Mission and Mission Staff each member of Team Colorado shall:

- 1. Conduct themselves with the pride and dignity of our Grandmothers and Grandfathers.
- 2. Treat visiting teams, spectators, officials, Host Society Officials, and dignitaries with respect.
- 3. Be fair at all times.
- 4. Believe in the honesty and the integrity of your opponents and officials.
- 5. Play the game for the games sake.
- 6. Accept peacefully without question the decision of the officials.
- 7. Play hard and to the limit of your abilities regardless of discouragement. True athletes do not give up, nor do they quarrel, cheat, bet or show off.
- 8. Accept both victory and defeat with pride and compassion, being neither boastful nor bitter.
